- Dec. 15, 1943 Ship commissioned at the Navy Yard, Phila., Pa.
- Jan. 17, 1944 Ship left Navy Yard, Phila., went to Pier 47,  
Delaware River for degaussing.
- Jan. 18, 1944 Underway
- 29, 1944 Anchored at Annapolis, Md., Liberty.
- 31, 1944 Underway
- Feb. 2, 1944 Docked in Norfolk, Va. Took on stores and gave  
liberty.
- 7, 1944 Underway for Trinidad, B.W.I.
- 11, 1944 Anchored in Port of Spain, Trinidad.
- During this time there were two liberty parties and  
one beer party. The beer party was held in Scotland  
Bay (a very pretty place). Good swimming, baseball and  
horseshoe pitching. Best of all.....the hot dogs and  
Pabst beer.
- March 1, 1944 Underway for the States. An event all hands  
looked forward to.
- 6, 1944 Docked in Navy Yard, Phila., Pa. - Leave - 5 days.
- 22, 1944 Underway without planes.
- 26, 1944 Docked in Norfolk, Va., (Nob)
- 29, 1944 Underway - Destination not know, but we all had a fair  
that it would be Panama.
- April 2, 1944 Went thru locks and dropped anchor in Gatun Lake.
- 3, 1944 Underway - thru Pedro Miguel and Miraflores Locks,  
docked in Panama.

 11, 1944 Anchored in Port of Spain, Trinidad.  
 During this time there were two liberty parties and  
 one beer party. The beer party was held in Scotland  
 Bay (a very pretty place). Good swimming, baseball and  
 horseshoe pitching. Best of all.....the hot dogs and  
 that beer.  
 March 1, 1944 Underway for the States. An event all hands  
 looked forward to.  
 6, 1944 Docked in Navy Yard, Phila., Pa.-leave-3 days.  
 22, 1944 Underway without planes.  
 26, 1944 Docked in Norfolk, Va., (Hop)  
 28, 1944 Underway-Destination not know, but we all had a fair  
 that it would be Panama.  
 April 2, 1944 Went thru locks and dropped anchor in Gatun Lake.  
 3, 1944 Underway - thru Pedro Miguel and Cristobal locks,  
 docked in Panama.

Ship loaded with tanks,jeeps and supplies. the  
Flight Deck was loaded with SB2c's,F6f's,TBF's,  
and SBD's.
- 19,1944 Docked behind Essex in Pearl Harbor. ~~Underway~~\* The  
Utah was still on it's side in front of the Essex,  
the Arizona was still there.
- 24,1944 Underway with the ESSES and DD's. Practice manouvers.
- 27,1944 Docked in Pearl Harbor. Underway with WASR,EESES,  
cruisers and cans.
- May 8,1944 Anchored inMAJURO(Marshall Islands).Taking on supplies.
- 15,1944 Underway with Essex,Wasp,cruisers and cans,steaming  
North on our first mission. This was our first mission  
against the enemy,and all hands were more or less thrilled  
being under the impression that this was one of the most  
dangerous undertakings.  
It could have turned out that way!
- 16,1944 Steamed North past MARCUS. Launched planes. Sank one sam-  
pan about 600 miles from Japan. This operation lasted thru  
May 25th. Hit the Island of Marcus and Wake... then steamed  
South.
- 26,1944 Anchored inMAJURO. Beer party for the crew and officers. A  
beautiful island consisting of a lot of undergrowth and  
lizzards. It was unusual to be leaning against a tree with  
a can of beer in your hand and not have a lizard crawling  
up your leg,or down your back. To play ball on this is-  
land it would be necessary to have a blood hound to retrieve  
the ball.
- June 6,1944 Underway with the LEXINGTON,ENTERPRISE AND PRINCETON,  
battleships ,cruisers and cans.
- 11,1944 BombedSAIPAN,TINIAN AND GUAM until June 16th.
- 15,1944 D-Day on Saipan. Troops invaded and our task force  
supported the capture and occupation until June 22nd.
- 19,1944 Task force attacked by 542 enemy planes. We shot down  
402 this day. Thrill seekers should hvae been with us  
this day. Operations in this area lasted until July 4th.  
Left area and ....
- July 9,1944 Anchored in ENIWETOK, a low,hot,sandy bar. Had beer party.
- 14,1944 Underway with the BUNKER HILL,LEXINGTON,PRINCETON  
battleships,cruisers and cans.
- 21,1944 Supported the capture and occupation of Guam, About July 19th  
received message that part of Jap Fleet was steaming down from N  
North. Planes took off late in afternoon. Caught up with the

19, 1944 Docked behind Essex in Pearl Harbor. Underway The  
Utah was still on it's side in front of the Essex,  
the Arizona was still there.

24, 1944 Underway with the Essex and DD's. Practice maneuvers.  
27, 1944 Docked in Pearl Harbor. Underway with WASH, ESSEX,

cruisers and cans.

8, 1944 Anchored in MARSHALL ISLANDS. Taking on supplies.  
12, 1944 Underway with Essex, WASH, cruisers and cans, steaming

North on our first mission. This was our first mission  
against the enemy, and all hands were more or less terrified  
being under the impression that this was one of the most  
dangerous undertakings.

It could have turned out that way!

16, 1944 Steamed North past MARSHALL ISLANDS. Launched planes. Took one am-  
pan about 600 miles from Japan. This operation lasted thru  
lay 23th. Hit the island of Marcus and Wake. Then steamed  
South.

28, 1944 Anchored in MARSHALL ISLANDS. Beer party for the crew and officers. A  
beautiful island consisting of a lot of undergrowth and  
lizards. It was unusual to be leaning against a tree with  
a can of beer in your hand and not have a lizard crawling  
up your leg, or down your back. To play ball on this is-  
land it would be necessary to have a blood hound to retrieve  
the ball.

6, 1944 Underway with the LEXINGTON, ENTERPRISE AND PRINCETON,  
battleships, cruisers and cans.

11, 1944 Bombed SAIPAN, TITIAN AND GUAM until June 18th.

15, 1944 D-Day on Saipan. Troops invaded and our task force  
supported the capture and occupation until June 22nd.

19, 1944 Task force attacked by 248 enemy planes. We shot down  
402 this day. Thrill seekers should have been with us  
this day. Operations in this area lasted until July 4th.  
Left Saipan and . . . .

9, 1944 anchored in ENRIQUEZ, a low, hot, sandy bar. Had beer party.  
14, 1944 underway with the BUNYAN and PRINCETON, battleships,  
cruisers and cans.

21, 1944 Supported the capture and occupation of Guam. About July 19th  
received message that part of 3rd Fleet was steaming down from  
North. Planes took off late in afternoon. Caught up with the



enemy and sank and damaged three of four carriers and a cruiser and cans. Planes returned late. Some had to make water landings. All pilots picked up. One Jap plane came in for a landing, but was waved off by the signal officers, he not having hook.

- July 22, 1944 supported the capture and occupation of TINIAN  
 25, 1944 Bombed the PALAU ISLANDS, striking at PELLIEU, BABELTHAUT and ANGUAR.  
 31, 1944 Dropped anchor in SAIPAN. refueled, rearmed. Coastal guns shelled TINIAN all night & day.
- August 1, 1944 underway. steamed north. made strike on the BONINS, hitting NAHA, JIMA, CHICHI JIMA and PAGAN  
 9, 1944 Anchored in ENIWOTOK again--the Paradise of the Pacific (like Hell).  
 23, 1944 underway with the FRANKLIN AND ~~ENTERPRISE~~ BELLEAU WOOD, for practice maneuvers.  
 25, 1944 ~~bombed~~ Anchored in ENIWOTOK, for the last time we hoped.  
 28, 1944 underway with the FRANKLIN, ENTERPRISE, cruisers and cans.  
 31, 1944 engaged in strikes on ~~FORMOSA, LUZON, SAMAR AND LEYTE~~ BONIN ISLANDS, THRU 2nd Sept.
- September 9, 1944 Anchored in SAIPAN, refueled and rearmed.  
 10, 1944 underway with FRANKLIN and ENTERPRISE, hit Yap and PALAU.  
 15, 1944 supported the capture and occupation of PELLEIEU.  
 20, 1944 Crossed the EQUATOR.  
 21, 1944 Anchored in MANUS ISLAND, in the ADMIRALTY ISLANDS. Initiated Pollywogs, all hands now Shellbacks. No beer party--No rest for the weary.  
 23, 1944 underway with the ENTERPRISE, FRANKLIN AND BELLEAU WOOD  
 25, 1944, engaged in strikes on FORMOSA, OKINAWA and the PHILIPPINES. Terrific opposition for a few days.
- October 10, 1944 FRANKLIN hit with bomb, HOUSTON hit with fish. CANBERRA hit with fish. Continuous attacks, day and night. Strikes made on FORMOSA, LUZON, SAMAR AND LEYTE, continuously for days.  
 20, 1944 supported the capture and occupation of LEYTE and SAMAR, PHILIPPINE ISLANDS.
- October 24, 1944 A day not to be forgotten. Attacked by dive bombers and torpedo planes. We saw the fish launched and headed for us. One for the bow and one for the stern. Weather and fate was with us this day. Just as the torpedo approached our bow, ship rose on crest of wave and torpedo passed underneath, exploding after it's run. The other one passed underneath the stern and exploded away from the ship.  
 25, 1944 Engaged Jap fleet off Island of Luzon. Carriers sunk and damaged, cruisers and cans sunk or damaged. During this engagement it was that the PRINCETON, ST. LO AND GAMBIA BAY were lost or sunk.  
 30, 1944 Attacked by Japs, FRANKLIN, AND BELLEAU WOOD hit.  
 31, 1944 Two planes crashed along our port and starboard bow. Pieces of the plane and pilots dropping all over the flight deck. No damage to our ship.

 6,1944 BUNKER HILL AND OAKLAND JOINED up. YORKTOWN  
 NORHT CAROINA left. Patroled and made strikes  
 on LUZON .  
 19,1944 Bombed Manila.  
 20,1944 HORNET AND PASDENA replaced the BUNKER HILL and  
 INDIANAPOLIS WHO are going back to the states.  
 22,1944 Anchored in ULITHI  
 29,1944 Underway with two cans to pick up new Air Group  
 at GUAM. Second carrier to anchor in GUAM since  
 beginning of the war. Other was an escort carrie  
 30,1944 Anchored in GUAM . Picked up new Air Group and  
 shoved off. Practiced landings with ait Group.  
 December 8,1944 Anchored in ULITHI, tokk on stores, rearmed and  
 refueled.  
 11,1944 Underway with the ESSEX, TICONDEROGA, LANGLEY,  
 SOUTH DAKOTA, MASSACHUSETTS, NORTH CAROLINA  
 OAKLAND, MOBILE BILOXI, ASTORIA and 16 cans.  
 15,1944 Supported the invasion of MINDORO, PHILIPPINES.  
 18,1944 Hit Typhoon, which caused severe damage to planes  
 and hangar deck. Destroyers capsized. Consideri  
 ing the weight of ~~the~~ above water, we were lucky  
 in not capsizing ourselves.  
 22,1944 Anchored in ULITHI for repairs. Spent ten days  
 in repairing damage. No beer party.  
 30,1944 Underway with TICONDEROGA ESSEX battleships, cruise  
 and cans. Preparing for invasion of LUZON.  
 Bombed Formosa Luzon. Operation lasted until  
 January 9, 1945.  
 January 10,1945 Entered CHINA SEA. Bombed SAIGON AND KAMRAHN  
 BAY.  
 12,1945 Made strikes on HATMAN, LONG KONG SWARTOW.  
 17,1945 Strikes on Formosa, On the 16th lost planes  
 over the side due to bad ewather.  
 21,1945 TICONDEROGA AND LANGLEY hit by enemy bombs.  
 26,1945 Anchored in ULITHI, refuelde, rearmed and took  
 on stores.  
 February 10,1945 Underway with LEXINGTON AND JOHN HANCOCK.  
 16,1945 Bombed Tokyo. Our air group shot down 27 planes.  
 17,1945 Bombed Tokyo. Ship 197 miles from TOKIO.  
 19,1945 Supported the capture and occupation of Iwo Jima  
 26,1945 Sidewiped by tanker while refueling, bad weather  
 27,1945 Made strikes on TOKYO weather heavy, not able to  
 see targets.  
 March 1,1945 Bombed Okninawa.  
 4,1945 Anchored in Ulithi, for the last time, we hope.  
 This was the best island we have been at yet.  
 Bing repaired by the JASON. Took on stores.  
 12,1945 Enemy plane flew low over the flight deck.  
 Turned ot come back, changed flight and hit the  
 Randolph.  
 14,1945 Underway with the FRANKLIN and the Randolph  
 Hancock



14, 1945 Underway with the Franklin and the Hancock  
 Randolph.  
 Turned of course back, changed flight and hit the  
 Enemy plane flew over the flight deck.  
 Being repaired by the Jason. Looked stores.  
 This was the best island we have been at yet.  
 Anchored in Ulithi. For the last time, we hope.  
 Bomed Oahu.  
 see targets.  
 Made strikes on TOKIO weather heavy, not sure to  
 be sidwiped by tanker while refueling. Bad weather  
 supported the capture and occupation of two lines  
 Bomed TOKYO. Ship 127 miles from TOKIO.  
 Bomed TOKYO. Our air group shot down 27 planes.  
 Underway with LEXINGTON and JOHN HANCOCK.  
 on stores.  
 Anchored in Ulithi, refueled, reamed and took  
 TICONDEROGA AND LANGLEY hit by enemy bombs.  
 over the side due to bad weather.  
 Strikes on Formosa. On the 18th lost planes  
 made strikes on HATMAN, LONG KONG SWARTOW.  
 Entered CHINA SEA. Bomed BAIKON AND KAMARU  
 January 9, 1945.  
 Bomed Formosa Inson. Operation lasted until  
 and cans. Preparing for invasion of Luzon.  
 Underway with TICONDEROGA, BATES, and
