Note 1:

There is a case of meningitis on board. This in itself is nothing over which to become panicky. There are two kinds of meningitis, the epidemic type and the isolated case type, where one person out of thousands will have it, but no one else will "catch" it. However, by the time we could be certain as to which type this case is, it would be too late, if it is the epidemic type. It has been found that a person is not likely to "catch" meningitis if, after exposure, he takes one of the sulfa drugs in prescribed doses for three days. That is what the Medial Officer started yesterday. Meningitis is not to be treated lightly. No one wants to have it, so take the sulfa pills as prescribed, three times a day. Don't waste them. They are not plentiful. They will cause varying amounts of discomfort according to the individual, but are easily worth it. Avoid overexposure to the sun while taking them. Sulfa drugs cause the skin to be extra sensitive to sunlight. They will cause less discomfort if taken around meal time.

Our present objective - ENIWETOK ATOLL in the northwestern part of the Marshalls. This is 669 miles from Turk, the main Jap base in the Caroline Islands; 362 miles from Ponape, a Jap air base in the Carolines and 537 miles from Wake Island. We will also be some 800 miles closer to Tokyo than we were in Tarawa..

The following information has been received from the Chief of Naval Operations and is quoted for compliance by all hands:

"It has come to the attention of the Chief of Naval Operations that members of the armed services in the South Pacific Area occasionally purchase from native inhabitants for shipment to the United States fans and other articles made from feathers of the bird of paradise and other birds of brilliant plumage.

"Under existing law it is illegal to import the plumage of wild birds into the United States except under special permits issued only for scientific and educational purposes. Shipments by members of the armed forces therefore are seized by Customs officers.

"It is unfortunate that naval and military personnel should waste their money for purchases which must be seized by Customs officials. Such purchases also stimulate the destruction of the birds which the law was enacted to protect.

"It is suggested, therefore, that the information contained in this letter made available to naval personnel in the Pacific Area in order to discourage the purchase of articles made from the feathers of birds of brilliant plumage."

Despite the fact that AlNav #183 was printed word for word in a recent Plan of the Day, considerable confusion still exists in the minds of many of the personnel of this ship who are entitled to participate in the benefits of the Family Allowance system. It is hoped that the following extracts from AlNav #183 and AlNav #175 will be of some help in throwing light on the situation. Further detailed information, to suit the case, may be obtained by calling at the ship's office:

1.

Money Allowance for Quarters. Only personnel who were in the first three pay grades on November 1, 1943, and who had applied for or were receiving Money Allowance for Quarters at that time, may continue to draw this allowance in the future. (Money Allowance for Quarters is a straight allowance of \$1.25 per day given by the government, with no contribution required from the man). However, in order to continue to receive this allowance, a man must register before February 1, 1944, a retroactive allotment of at least \$37.50 per month in favor of the dependent for whom he claims the allowance. This is not a contribution on his part, but simply a means of insuring that the allowance actually goes to the dependent. There are two classes of dependents: A lawful wife and unmarried children under 21 years of age (legitimate or adopted), and a mother or father who is in fact dependent upon the man for chief support. Personnel of the first three pay grades who meet the requirements above may elect either Money Allowance for Quarters or Family Allowance, but once having elected Family Allowance may not later choose Money Allowance for Quarters. Generally speaking, a man having but one dependent will profit by electing money Allowance for Quarters instead of Family allowance.

2.

<u>Family Allowance</u>. Enlisted personnel of <u>all</u> pay grades are now eligible for Family Allowance benefits. Family Allowance is the system under which a man's account is checked for \$22.00 or \$27.00 per month, as the case may be. Tho this sum the government adds its contribution and sends the total to the man's dependents. There are three classes of dependents:

Class "A" - Wife and/or child.

Class "B-1" - Parent, brother, and/or sister dependent upon the man for <u>chief</u> support. Brother and sisters mus be unmarried and either under 18 years of age or physically or mentally incapacitated.

Class "B" - Parent, brother, or sister dependent upon the man for <u>substantial</u> support. This is payable only when there is no allowance payable to and Class B-1 dependent.

The contributions of the man and of the government are as follows:

Man -

- (A) \$22.00 if for only one class of dependents ("A", "B-1", or "B").
- (B) \$27.00 if for more than one class of dependents ("A", "B-1", or "B").

Government -

Class "A" - Wife alone, \$28.00 (thus wife receives \$50.00).

Wife and one child, \$58.00, with \$20.00 for each additional child. (Thus where wife and two children, check received would be for 100.00, though man contributes only \$22.00).

No wife, but one child, \$20.00, with \$20.00 for each additional child. Former wife, divorced, \$20.00, irrespective of any amounts payable to wife and children, but divorce decree may set special limitation.

Former wife, divorced, and one child, \$50.00, with \$20.00 for each additional child.

Children must be unmarried and either under 18 years of age or physically incapacitated.

Note II - Family Allowance Information (Cont'd)

Class "B-1" -

One parent, but no brother or sister, \$28.00.

Two parents, but no brother or sister, \$46.00.

One parent and one brother or sister, \$46.00, with \$11.00 for each additional brother or sister.

Two parents and one brother or sister, \$57.00, with \$11.00 for each additional brother or sister.

A brother or sister, but no parent, \$20.00, with \$11.00 for each additional brother or sister.

Class "B" -

A parent or a brother or sister, one or more, \$15.00.

Note: Figures for government's contribution are based on situations where man's dependents fall within a single class. Where more than one class of dependents are involved, government's contributions are materially larger.

VENEREAL PROPHYLAXIS

Attention is called to all hands of the danger of venereal infection following sexual contact, and to the means of prevention of such infection by adequate prophylaxis.

Several sources of prophylaxis are available to service men as enumerated, with comments on relative value.

- Sanitubes will be placed on the quarter deck, so that each man may have one on going ashore, for self administration.
 Comment: this is only fairly efficient, since it is administered by the individual who is usually unfamiliar with the details necessary to make it effective.
- Tablets of Sulfa-thiozole will be placed on the quarter deck so that each man returning from liberty and needing prophylaxis can take 4 tablets in addition to the use of the Sanitube.
 Comment; A new method, and apparently fairly successful, but not definitely proven as yet.
- 3. Prophylaxis service will be maintained in the sick bay of the ship for all hands returning from liberty at any time.

 Comment: A combination of the best known methods will be efficiently administered by a pharmacist's mate. <u>BUT</u> hours may have elapsed since sexual contact, and this may be the deciding factor in success or failure.
- 4. The best Present yourself to an Army or Navy prophylaxis station as soon as possible after contact. There will be service available. Make it your business to find out where they are. The shorter the time between intercourse and prophylaxis the more effective the prophylaxis.

Note II:

Whenever boats are use while in Pearl Harbor the O. O. D., before a boat leaves the ship, will ensure that the coxswain has been instructed in the 14th Naval District Order No. 73-43 (Regulations to reduce interference between boat traffic and sea plane traffic in Pearl Harbor) and that a copy of the chart showing power boat lanes and crossings is posted in the boat. The uniform for boat crews in undress whites.

Note III:

In the event of an air raid while in Pearl Harbor, all Naval personnel on shore shall clear the streets and seek shelter during the raid. When the "all clear" signal is given, all personnel proceed immediately to their ships or stations. This last provision applies after an actual air raid only.

Note IV:

"Sangy" and the squadron dog are not to be permitted ashore. Quarantine laws in Oahu are quite strict in regard to animals.

Note V:

Attention of all hands is invited to the general information on Pearl Harbor that was put out on the occasion of our last visit. As far as we know, it has not changed.

Note VI:

All officers who have not done so turn in morphine syrettes to Dick Bay <u>today</u> without fail.

Note II: While operating in excessively hot, humid areas, the salt lost from the body by way of the sweat is frequently greater than the salt replaced by the food that we eat. This salt loss results in unpleasant symptoms of headache, dizziness, weakness, and occasionally muscle cramps. To combat these symptoms, mor salt must be taken.

Salt tablets have been place in the general mess and the Wardroom, and each officer and man is urged to take two tablets with each meal. Taking the salt tablets on an empty stomach frequently results in gastric irritation (bellyache), so it is advised that the tablets be taken while eating so that they mix with the food.

D-5212. FIREMEN.

(1) FIREMAN, SECOND CLASS

A FIREMAN, SECOND CLASS, within a reasonable time on board ship, should be expected to know; The names of the Captain, Executive Officer, Heads of the Departments, Engineering Division Officers, and other principal officers in his own ship; the duties that he is expected to perform at general quarters and emergency drills, and be able to recognize the signals for these drills. He should know the type, location, and general features of boilers and main engines in own ship, and the safety precautions to be observed in entering engineering spaces. He should know the location of boats, guns, bridges, officers' quarters, chief petty officers' quarters, principal compartments, fire-room, engine-room, and steering engine-room. He should have a detailed knowledge of his own part of the ship including the location of all fire plugs, and other fire apparatus.

(2) FIREMAN, FIRST CLASS.

(A) PRACTICAL FACTORS

- (a) WATCH STANDING.— Demonstrate ability to stand underway and at anchor watches in the engineering spaces to which assigned.
- (b) TOOLS.—Demonstrate ability to effectively use tools commonly employed in engineroom and fireroom routine maintenance.
- (c) AUXILIARIES.—Demonstrate ability to locate and identify Engineering Department auxiliaries in own ship.

- 1. It has come to the attention of the Bureau of Naval Personnel that certain unauthorized ribbons are being worn among naval personnel. In this connection attention is directed to the following:
 - a. The only campaign medals or ribbons authorized for the present war are:
 - (1) The American Defense Service Medal.
 - (2) The American Campaign Medal.
 - (3) The European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign Medal.
 - (4) The Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal.

Insignia on the ribbons of these medals commemoration compaigns or engagements are authorized by Alnav or General Order.

- b. The Navy Expeditionary Medal The only authorization for this medal or ribbon for this war is to the defenders of Wake Island December 1943. It is understood that this ribbon is being worn as a "Convoy" or "Landing Force" or other similar purpose. Such wearing of the Navy Expeditionary Medal or ribbon is Unauthorized.
- c. Merchant Marine Ribbons Persons who have been awarded Merchant Marine medals or ribbons while serving in the Merchant Marine and prior to entering upon active duty in the Navy are authorized to wear such ribbons, provided such medals or ribbons were created by Federal law. Persons on active duty in the Navy are not eligible for the award of Merchant Marine medals or ribbons. Naval personnel serving in merchant vessels, such a armed-guard crews, communication personnel, etc., are not entitled to wear Merchant Marine ribbons by virtue of such service.
- d. Naval Reserve Medal The basic requirement for the Naval Reserve Medal is 10 years honorable service in the Naval Reserve. Only such persons as have been awarded this medal by the Chief of Naval Personnel are entitled to wear the ribbon.
- e. The Bureau of Naval Personnel has been informed that a ribbon styled "the Anti-Submarine and Convoy" ribbon is being worn by some personnel. There are probably others under various names. No such ribbons are authorized.
- 2. Commanding officers will take all practicable means of insuring compliance with regulations regarding the wearing of service ribbons. Nothing in the above shall be interpreted to preclude wearing of ribbons of decorations awarded or of campaign service ribbons duly authorized during or before the present war. BuPers.

NOTE 2: MORLEY, who fell overboard the other night, was just plain lucky in being picked up after only about 15 minutes in the water. He fell over from the weather deck. The lesson to be learned from his experience is: - Don't move around topside until your eyes have become adapted to the dark. In his case he started feeling his way around and had gone through the life lines before realizing that anything was wrong. He had his life belt with him, one of the type that have to be blown up. The valve on it was not closed, so when ho got around to inflating it, he first had to suck out a quart or so of water. His life belt light was in his locker. Fortunately, the destroyer was able to hear him yell. Remember these points, they might save your life some day - and follow the guide lines between doors and hatches topside.
