In accordance with request of reference (a). War Diary of this vessel for period covering 1 April 1942 through 22 April 1942 is submitted herewith.

1. In accordance with reference (a), an action report covering the landing on Guadalcanal Island, Solomon Islands from August 7, 1942 to August 9, 1942 is submitted herewith.

2. At 0600, August 7, while approaching the Transport Area XRAY in Attack Force Approach Disposition "AR-3", (Annex Interrogatory to Commander Task Force Sixty-Two Operation Plan A3-42,) a plane with running lights was observed. This plane was believed to have been launched by H.M.A.S. AUSTRALIA. At the same instant a small craft was observed bearing 100° (true), close inshere.

At 0615, cruisers and destroyers of the Fire Support Sections opened bembardment on the shore line at Guadalcanal. Simultaneously, fire was opened in the Tulagi Area.

At 0630 the small craft inshore was hit and burst into flame. It appeared to be loaded with gasoline or oil.

At 0653, having reached the Transport Area and receiving orders to launch boats, got the first boats into water. At 0734 completed launching boats. All boats from this vessel proceeded to Transports as directed in the Covering Operation Plan.

At 0656 received signal "Zero Hour is 0910."

At 1100, got underway in response to signal, formed Cruising Disposition AC-3, base course 0000 (true), speed 13 kmots, and started evasive courses by ship turn movements, distance between ships 1000 yards, maneuvering Squadron XRAY in area bounded by Guadaleanal Island on the South, Florida Island on the North, and Savo Island on the west.

At 1150 Japanese planes dropped bombs in the area where the squadron had been anchored.

At 1152, approximately twenty planes, believed to be "Mitsubishi MC-20" Transport Bombers, came through the Transport formation from astern. Fire was opened at 1155 and it appeared that at least four planes were hit by gunfire from this vessel. One plane was definitely hit by a 3-inch shell from #1 gun, and seen to break in two, all parts hitting the water as debris in flames, which lasted a few seconds and disappeared.

At 1158 the U.S.S. GRORGE F. ELLIOTT, in the right hand column of the Transport formation, was seen in flames and smoke. It was believed that she had been hit by a falling plane which was on fire.

At 1210 ceased fire, all guna.

It is my opinion that at least fourteen of the attacking planes were brought down during this attack.

The tactics of the enemy appeared to be an effort to fly between the columns of ships at torpedo launching altitude, in order that opposing fire would be restricted by our ships fouling the range of fire foreach other.

Things happened so swiftly that complete recording of events was not accomplished. It is believed that the action lasted about six or eight minutes. This vessel expended 800 rounds of 20 mm amount tion and 27 rounds of 3" ammunition during this phase of the action. Extreme care was exercised to prevent firing into our cwn ships.

The conduct and discipline displayed by officers and crew of this command were of the highest order, and the Commanding Officer has only the highest praise for all personnel concerned.

The sea was smooth, wind from Southeast, force one.

No damage was sustained by this vessel.

No casualties were sustained in this vessel.

At 1340 took aboard six casualties from an ELLIOTT boat. These were marines from the beach who were enroute to the U.S.S. ELLIOTT when the air attack occurred. None of the casualties were serious.

At 1515 received orders from OTC to land stores just west of Beach Red. Vessels lay to landing cargo.

Unloading was slow due to shortage of boats and lighters. Two Tare Roger boats from this vessel had been submerged, and were damaged beyond repair by ship's force. Both W.L. lighters were out of commission most of the night and repairmen were working on them. This vessel, at present, has insufficient boat personnel to run boats continuously for any protracted period.

At about 2130 took aboard 1st Lieut. P. Glass, Jr., USMCR, with six Marines, twenty-five naval enlisted, and one Coast Guard, survivors from the ELLIOTT. Four of the Navy enlisted, and the Coast Guard surfman, subsequently left the ship when the ELLIOTT boat was ordered to clear the side when the ship started to regain the Transport Area. None were injured.

On Sunday, August 9, unloading was continued from 0000 to 0150, when parachute flares were observed over both Guadalcanal and Tulagi areas. The ship was darkened and unloading discontinued.

The flares over Tulagi silhouetted Squadron YOKE vessels, and it appears certain that those over Guadal-canal served the same purpose for this squadron. The nature of the flares, whether from enemy or our own planes, was not

known.

The air raids and warnings, boat trouble, and difficulties of landing cargo interfered with the task in a considerable way and, consequently, departure was taken with approximately seventy-five per cent of the cargo still on board.

- 1. In accordance with reference (a), an action report covering the movements and operations of this ship during the landing on Guadalcanal Islands, Solomon Islands, from August 7, 1942 to August 9, 1942, both dates included, is submitted.
- 2. During the approach to transport area on August 7 in prescribed formation, a plane with running lights burning was observed forward of starboard beam at 0600, minus eleven time. This plane is believed to have been from one of the escort cruisers. At the same time, a small vessel was observed bearing two points on starboard bow, distance about three miles, close inshore.

At 0615, cruisers and destroyers of the Fire support sections opened fire on the shore line at Guadalcanal. At the same time fire was noticed in the Tulagi area.

After four salves from a destroyer in the van at 0630, the small craft ahead was hit and burst into flame - evidently loaded with gasoline or oil from spread of flame and black smoke.

At 0653, upon order after reaching transport area, launched first boats. Completed launching last boat at 0734, a period of 41 minutes. Boats proceeded as directed in Pirst Marine Division Landing Plan. Began launching amphibian tractors from holds 1, 2, 3 and 5.

At 0656 received signal "Zero hour is 0910."

At 0902 close bembardment of beaches began preparatory to landing troops.

At 0920, successful beach landing indicated by shore signal.





- 1. In accordance with reference (a), an action report covering the dive bombing attack on Task Unit 62.4.5 on October 15, 1942, is submitted herewith.
- 2. At 1633 Zone (-) Il time in Lat. 13°-14' S., Long. 163°-32' E., this task unit was attacked by Japanese zero fighters dive bombing on the vessels. Four planes were seen, two of which attacked the ALCHIBA. There may have been additional planes which were not observed.

The Task Unit Commander was in the BELLATRIX which was formation guide, the ALCHIBA in position one thousand yards on port beam of guide, the NICHOLAS screening to starboard and the JAMESTOWN screening to port. Vessels were proceeding on course 220° (true) at standard speed of 14 knots.

Radar bearings signalled from the U.S.S. NICHOLAS throughout the day had indicated considerable activity in the air. Information indicated presence of an enemy carrier within three hundred miles to the northward.

Two planes were sighted at 1633 making a dive attack on the BELIATRIX. At 1634 two planes were seen diving on this vessel from dead ahead, on plane was in its dive, the other approaching at about 5000 feet elevation, position angle 35°. The sun bore 240° (true) and rendered sighting planes difficult. Fire was opened on planes with 3"/50 and 20mm. guns. Maneuvering the ship was not considered advisable.

At 1635 a bomb landed about fifteen feet off the port bow, the water from the explosion deluging the forward part of the ship.

At 1636 a second bomb landed approximately thirty feet off the starboard quarter.

Neither of the near misses caused any personnel casualties or apparent damage to the ship. One small fragment of bomb was brought on board by the water after the explosion of the first bomb. The bombs were estimated to be of 250 or 500 peunds. The planes did not strafe the ship or personnel. Exemination of vessel showed no damage from enemy attack.

The volume of fire from the ship's guns was considerable and is believed to have influenced the plane gunners in their failure to fire. The accuracy of the bombers was almost too good. The failure of the bombs to cause fragmentation damage to the hull is not understood. The fact that they struck near the bow and stern where structural strength is greatest is believed to account for the lack of structural damage.

The 20mm guns on this vessel have no stops to control the arc of fire. Control by the gunner during an action is not satisfactory. Slight damage was done to the mainmast and rigging by ship's own gun fire.

No definite damage to the planes was observed. The speed of the target was estimated as 290 knots and the lead taken by the gunners was insufficient. One plane appeared to webble badly passing over the ship, but recovered and did not appear seriously damaged.

3. This was the first experience this vessel has had with dive bombers and it was very valuable. The behavior of officers and crew under fire was splendid. There have been few opportunities for any kind of firing practice since guns were installed and, in my opinion, no target practice could approach this experience in value. Minor faults of communication and procedure appeared and steps have been taken to correct them insofar as practicable. he urgent used for certain types of cargo in advanced bases necessatates carrying considerable deck load in this type of vessel. In spite of careful planning for stowage of such cargo, considerable indedance to free deck passage to battle, fire, and abandon ship stations exists on every voyage. Efforts to improve this situation continue.


