

CHAPTER 48

SPARE PARTS AND STOWAGE SCHEDULE

48-1 ALLOWANCE LIST:-

(a) The Ship's Allowance List consists of one book in which are listed the spare parts, standard and special tools, portable equipments, a partial list of installed equipment, and consumable supplies that are used in the maintenance of the equipment on board. This book is divided into three general parts:

- (1) Part I covers Machinery Items.
- (2) Part II covers Hull Items.
- (3) Part III covers Title "C" or Consumable Supplies.

All items are divided into groups according to the Navy Filing Manual; Part III lists the commissioning allowance of such items for three months supply. The conditions under which the Commanding Officer may vary these quantities are indicated in Group L7 under Title "C" items.

The general purposes and uses of the allowance list are fully described in Group L7 of the allowance list including definitions of Title "A" or installed items, Titles "B" and "C" spare parts and other items. Group L8 covers kinds of requisitions, preparation, etc. The items formerly listed in a separate navigation allowance are now listed in Part II (Hull), as is the Commissary equipment formerly listed in the "EX-S&A" allowance list. The ordnance allowance list is a separate list issued by the Bureau of Ordnance.

(b) The ship's equipage records are maintained by the Gunnery Officer (Stores Officer) on a separate copy of the allowance list. This copy of the allowance list is commonly referred to as the "marked up copy" and will be received from the commissioning activity with original entries made and will be maintained in accordance with Article 2637-2 S&A Manual (change 35). In this book, opposite each item of equipage (Title "B") will be entered the following information.

- (1) Compartment in which stowed.
- (2) Box number in case of spare part boxed units.

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48-1 ALLOWANCE LIST:-

- (3) Date of receipt.
- (4) Quantity now on hand (corrected as required).
- (5) If desired, invoice numbers and activity from whom received.

48-2 STOWAGE SCHEDULE:-

Whereas the allowance list describes every item of equipment which should be on board, the stowage schedule gives the actual location of all allowed items aboard ship at the time of delivery. The stowage schedule is coordinated with the allowance list through the Navy filing numbers. However, it does not attempt to itemize every individual spare part or item of portable equipment aboard ship.

48-3 STOWAGE SCHEDULE CONTENTS:-

The Stowage Schedule is provided by the building yard and includes the following information:

(a) An Alphabetical Index giving:

- (1) The general description of spare parts of equipment.
- (2) Group number.
- (3) Box numbers or other "units of stowage." "Units of Stowage" are the physical units handled at the time of out-fitting. They may consist of permanent metal boxes, temporary boxes (wood, paper, etc.), or bundles of material ultimately intended for stowage on shelves, racks, in bins, lockers, etc.

An example of the Alphabetical Index is given in TABLE 48-1 following:

(b) A Numerical List of Box Numbers giving:

- (1) Group numbers.
- (2) Dimensions.
- (5) Unit of stowage.
- (4) Short title of contents.
- (5) Place of stowage, etc.

(c) A Compartment Schedule Listing, giving:

- (1) Compartment name and number.
- (2) Box numbers or identities of each stowage unit contained therein.
