- 1. At 1755 minus 10 zone time 17 June 1944 in Latitude 13°24'N and Longitude 148°23'E on course 142°T speed eight (8) knots in Task Group 53.16 consisting of LST's 70, 117, 118, 123, 125, 207, 219, 220, 241, 247, 269, 343, 399, 447, 449, and 488, LCI's 464, 465, 466, 467, 468, 469, 470, 472, and 473, Agenor, Aloe, and Holly as main body of formation and Stemble, PC 549, PC 555, PC 1125, SC 504, SC 521, SC 667, SC 724, SC 727, SC 1273, YMS 136, YMS 184, YMS 195, YMS 216, YMS 237, YMS 242 as screen. (Task Group Commander Captain G.B. Carter, U.S.N. in U.S.S. Stemble) word was received by voice radio (SCR) from task group commander of approach of enemy planes from starboard. Went to General Quarters. Guns were manned almost immediately. This ship was on the port of the main body of the formation attack by three Japanese torpedo planes (Kate) was from the starboard course of attacking planes being about 070°(t). Started firing at about 1758. Two planes passed ahead and one passed astern all at a distance of about eight hundred yards. All three were fired on but none were observed to be hit by this ships guns. Last plane in attack after having passed ahead was seen to be hit in the engine by fire probably from LST 220 and was seen to take fire, crash and burn about 5000 yards bearing about 080°(t) from this ship.
- 2. No torpedo tracks were seen but last plane in attack was seen to launch a torpedo from a height of about fifty feet about three hundred yards ahead of center of main body of formation. The LCI 468 ahead and in center of the main body of the formation was observed to suffer an explosion in the bow shortly thereafter.
  - No strafing was observed.
  - 4. All guns functioned perfectly. All ammunition was perfect.
- 5. Gunfire of this ship and of other ships in vicinity seemed to be very poor. Most tracers were observed to be behind and below all targets.
  - 6. This ship suffered no casualties.
