In the assault phase of this operation, this ship was assigned to the Western Task Force, Follow up Force "B".

After the initial landing, this ship became a part of the Shuttle Force.

Part II

1. On 19 June 1944, at 1245, orders were received from Convoy Commander to anchor in anchorage area off UTAH beach.

At 1300, orders from the USS BAYFIELD directed us to beach prior to 1330.

At 1303 dropped anchor in ten fathous of water to swing ship in order to make proper approach for beaching.

At 1310 underway preceeding to beach, 4.

5. At 1315 terrific explosion of mine.

Part III

The ship broke interjust forward of the superstructure; the stern stopped dead in the water and began to settle, The bow continued to make headway for approximately six hundred yards.

The Commanding Officer was suspended from the halyards by his right leg and was unable to observe the actions of the crew.
