

The battleship in the forewater s the Nebraska, and astern is seen the Rhode Island. The Atlantic fleet in British waters, under Rear Admiral Schroeder, is the most powerful fleet that the United States has ever assembled, and probably the most powerful fleet that has ever prossed the Atlantic. The substitution of the new type of "Dreadnought" battleship causes a displacement 30,000 tons heavier than the fleet which Rear Admirals Evans and Sperry took round the world three years ago, and, like its predecessor, consists of sixteen battleships. Visits such as this which the United States ships are making to French as well as English ports, have in the past been rare. On only one other occasion, indeed, in the last quarter of a century has an American squadron visited English ports.

# SOME NICKNAMES MORE OR LESS USED

Aaron Burr Said to Have Been Author of 'Father of His Country.'

TITLE OF 'OLD HICKORY'

Names Bestowed on Various States and Cities During the Past Century.

The use or origin of nicknames for many of our Presidents and generals and other public characters and many of our cities and states has for half a century given me a good deal of interest and innumerable hours of research; although, of course, it would be impossible for anyone to present an article on such a complex subject with completeness.

We are all aware that Washington became known early after the revoluflonary war as the "Father of His Country," but how few of us are aware of the fact that Aaron Burr, the man who killed Alexander Hamilton in a duel at Weehawken, N. J., about a hundred years ago, was the author of the appellation? We all know that Andrew Jackson received the nickname of 'Old Hickory' early in the '20s, but how many people have traced the bestowal of the nickname to an old New Hampshire Democrat named Isaac Hill?

Or that Jackson bestowed the nickname of "Martie" on Martin Van Buren? We are all on affectionate terms with "Old Abe," but not many are aware of the fact that it was Stophen A. Douglass who referred first to Abraham Lincoln in that way, and that it was George Alfred Townsend who accompanied Mr. Lincoln from Springfield to Washington in February, 1861, as correspondent of the Philadelphia Press, who first applieds the term of "Father Abraham" in a newspaper. And it was President Lincoln, after Andrew Johnson had made one of his last Union speeches in the United States Senate, in February, 1862, who called the great Tennesseean "the Andrew Jackson of the War," who was afterwards generally known as "Old Andy" or just plain 'Andy Johnson

What Presidents Were Called.

Many of our Presidents were given nicknames. John Quincy Adams was known as the "Great Commoner." Monroe will always be remembered by the "Doctrine" that is connected with his name. William Henry Harrison was "Tippecanoe," on account of his splendid Indian victories in Indiana. in the late '30s. And Benjamin Harrison was widely cartoconed and referred to by Democrats as "My Grand-father's Hat." President Zachariah Taylor earned the sobriquet of 'Rough and Ready" during the Mexlean war. Bucharan was known as 'Old Buck" and as Andrew Johnson was referred to by his enemies as "His Accidency." Grant earned his nicknames during the war, the best of them "Unconditional Surrender Grant." Dana of the Sun called Hayes "8 to , Hayes," and still meaner names, none of which followed the President to his grave. Arthur was ften "Prince Arthur." McKinley was Cleveland was just "Grover."
