
"One of the unique characteristics

Christ differs rom other religious teachers and ounders among other things in this hat while they only offered a system of thought or a series of revelations. Christ proposed to endue his followers with power through the Holy Spirit. Other teachers might show the way ip the heights of attainment, but He eached down a mighty arm to help men up the steeps. Zooroaster, Budd Confucias taught many beautiful truths, but they had no power to of er to help men to live up to these ruths, But Jesus we are told taught with power and His disciples preach ed in the 'demonstration of the Spirit and of power.' Wherever Jesus went there was a shock of energizing pow er, devils were cast out, storms were almed, even, the dead were raised This same power brought Him out of he tomb with a body transmitted into glorified condition, and wherever His Gospel is truly proclaimed there the same power begins its work of

"The world is 'dead in trespasses and sins,' moral sensibilities are dull, consciences seared, moral impulses corrupted, the ethical will inert. What the world needs is not so much more moral truth though it needs that bad enough, but power to live up to what it already knows. Everywhere mankind has better ideals than ac tions, everywhere mankind is living below the level of their moral standards. This is what the great heathen religious and ethical systems such as Buddhism and Confuciansism lacked-the power to vitalize men with new moral energy. 
