WASHINGTON, Nov. 11.—That here are nearly as many Japanese the whole United States 10 years ago, is a fact revealed in a statement is sued by the bureau of the census of the department of commerce. The 1920 census shows a country-wide population of 111,010 Japanese as against 72,157 10 years ago, an increase of 54.8 per cent.
