TO WELCOME HEROES OF NEW MEXICO AT EL PASO TONIGHT

Midnight Demonstration Planned for 158th Regiment; Governors of New Mexico and Arizona to Give Each Yank the Glad Hand.

El Paso, Tex., April 29.—A midnight welcome will be given the 158th Regiment upon its arrival here tonight, according to the present plans of the welcome committee. Governor Campbell and Lieutenant Governor Keith, together with the members of the state staff, will go to Camp Sherman as soon as the troops start arriving there for demobilization and will personally welcome each member of the regiment from New Mexico and Arizona in the name of the state they represent. This was announced here tonight. The latest report on the troop train of fourteen cars carrying the regiment will be the effect of a special train at midnight tonight.

DEPUTIES OF ITALY SUPPORT ORLANDO

Chamber of Deputies Votes Confidence in Cabinet by Count of 382 to 40, Latter Votes Being Cast by Socialists.

BALLOTING FOLLOWS ADDRESS BY PREMIER

Italian Delegation Can Now Return to Paris With Increased Authority, Is View of Roman Newspapers.

Rome, Thursday, April 29.—Premier Orlando's government has given an unanimous vote of confidence in the Italian senate tonight, following the vote of confidence given him by the house of deputies. A great demonstration followed the premier's address before the senate.

Rome, April 29.—The Chamber of Deputies tonight voted confidence in the cabinet by a count of 382 to 40, the latter votes being cast by socialists.


The vote followed an address by Premier Orlando in the chamber. Former Premier Giolitti followed the premier and was unanimously applauded, except by the intrapartisan socialists, whose spokesman, Deputy Duranti, explained why the socialists could not give a vote of confidence.

Now the Italian delegation can return to Paris with increased authority to continue peace negotiations, is the dominant note in press comment of the parliamentary vote of confidence given in the chamber tonight.

The premier had before pronounced the details of his program for peace and the declaration of a general amnesty for all political prisoners.
