




TRIAL CAPTAIN OF THE MORENO
Captain Joseph I. Kemp acted as commander of the big new battleship when she went through her recent evolutions off the New England coast.




GREAT ARGENTINE BATTLESHIP MORENO RETURNS HERE FROM TRIAL TRIP
