Personnel of the Supply Department includes storekeepers (general and disbursing), ship's cooks, bakers, butchers, barbers, cobblers, laundrymen, tailors, soda fountain men, officers' cooks and stewards and stewards' mates.

Supply is charged with the procurement, receipt stowage, issue and accounting for the supplies necessary to keep the crew fed, clothed, and paid, as well as to provide them with the necessities of life and some luxuries, laundry, tailor, cobbler, and barber services.

The Supply Officer is Lt. Comdr. J. R. Johnston (SC), U.S.N., of Stoneham, Massachusetts.

Lt. M. W. Shaw, (SC), U.S.N.R., of Louisville, Kentucky, is the Senior Assistant to the Supply Officer.

The Assistant for Disbursing is Ensign C. E. Sigety (SC), U.S.N.R., from New York City.

The General Stores Officer is Chief Pay Clerk F. C. Satterfield, U.S.N., of San Diego, California.

Acting Pay Clerk W. H. McFarland, U.S.N., of Long Beach, California, is the Commissary Officer.

COMMISSARY

The crew is fed three times daily at an allowed cost of 65c per man. The average monthly

cost of provisions consumed by the General Mess amounts to \$27,000.

SHIP'S STORE-FOUNTAIN

The store carries the items which are necessary for a man to live comfortably aboard ship, plus some luxury and gift articles which are procured in foreign ports visited, such as alligator handbags, perfumes, watches, and cigars. Selling prices average 12% above cost in order to accrue profits which are expended for the amusement and contentment of the crew. The fountain has a hardening capacity of 160 gallons of ice cream, and dispenses soft drinks such as Pepsi-Cola, Coca-Cola, and root beer. Sales average \$12,000 a month.

DISBURSING

The monthly payroll is about \$75,000, which is exclusive of the amount deducted from the crew's accounts for allotments to dependents, insurance, War Bonds, and savings.

CLOTHING

Sales of regulation clothing and small stores amount to about \$8,000 monthly.

SERVICES

Barber, cobbler, tailor, and laundry services are rendered free to all hands.
