

several factories are booked ahead


on orders for boy doll babies.




"SNOWBIRDS" AND "POLAR BEARS" INVADE PENNSYLVANIA

these young people have been gamboling outdoors in bathing suits at Harrisburg.




SUBMARINE ASHORE ON ROCKS OFF SAN DIEGO, CAL.


Another in the series of catastrophes that have occurred to the little American fleet of submersibles overtook them during a storm on the California coast.
