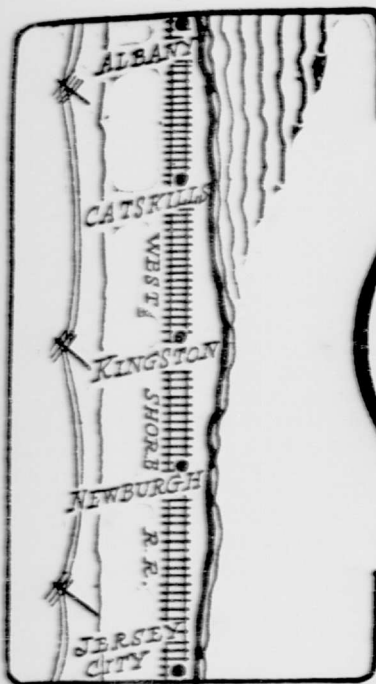


## TEN PROGRESSIVE EPOCHS IN THE HISTORY OF THE HUDSON RIVER— WHAT NEXT?

ROBERT FULTON STEAMED UP THE RIVER IN THE CLERMONT IN 1807.

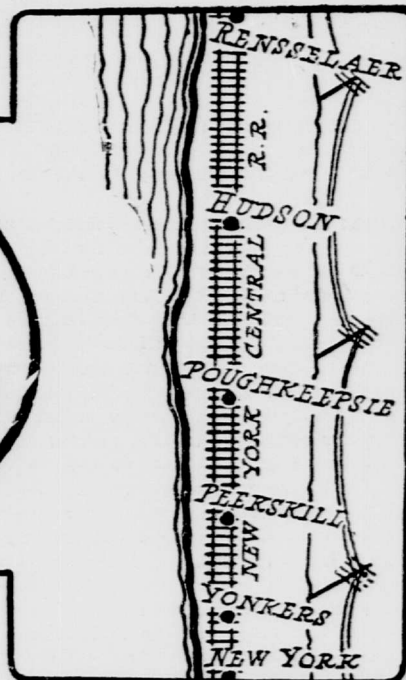


FIRST TELEGRAPH LINE ALONG ITS BANKS, 1847.



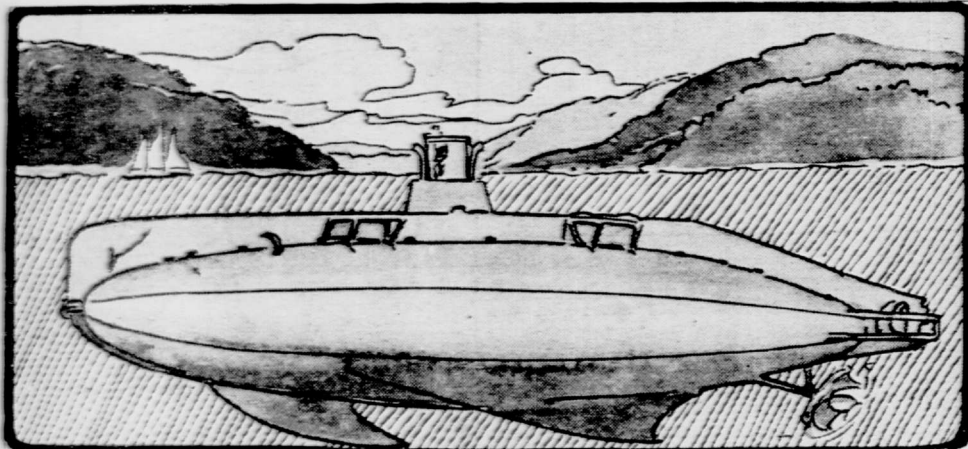
GLENN H. CURTISS, THE BIRD-MAN.

Who can get nearer to heaven whenever he feels like it than most of us want to go—just yet.

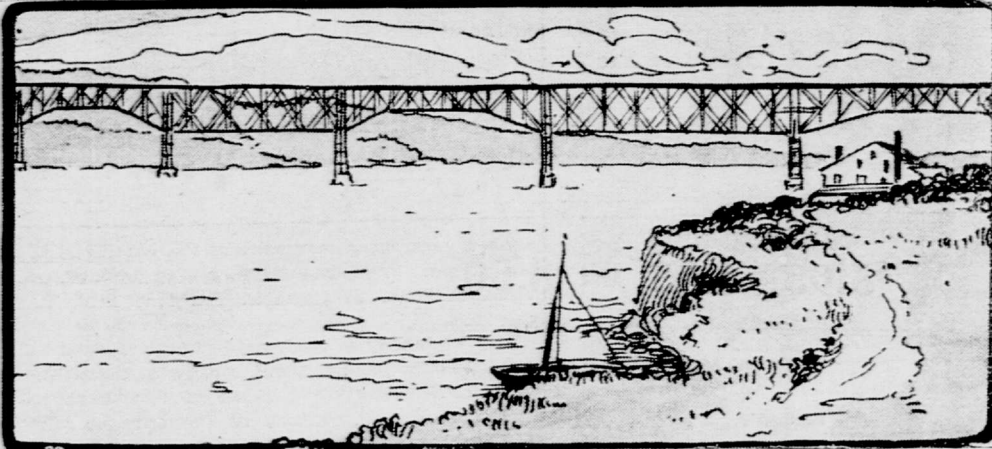


FIRST RAILROAD LINE ALONG ITS EASTERN SIDE, 1851.

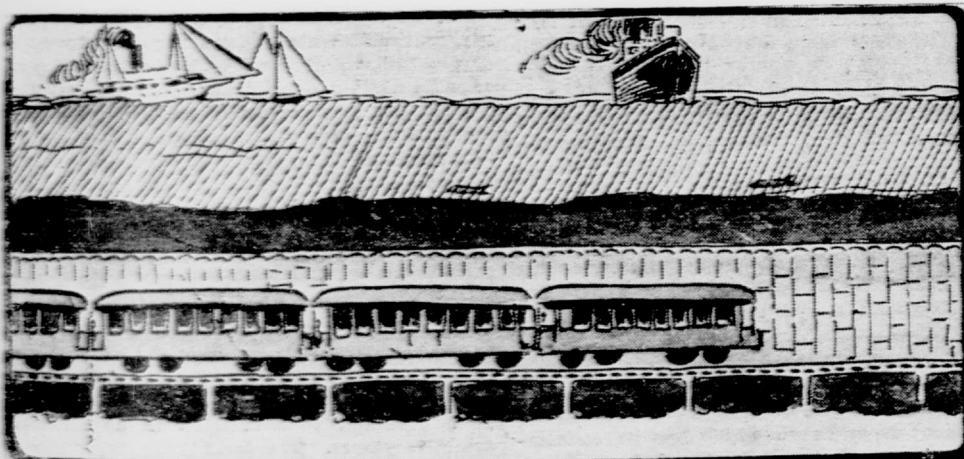
FIRST TELEPHONE LINE ALONG ITS BANKS, 1887.



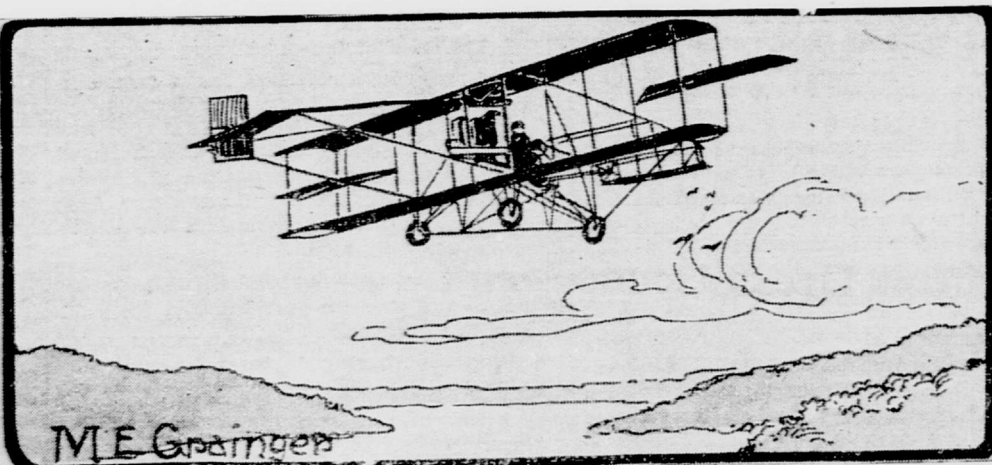
SERGEANT EZRA LEE DIVED IN IT IN THE FIRST SUBMARINE IN 1776.
