

## BIOGRAPHY OF LCDR. W. A. BACCHUS, USN

LCDR Wilfred A. BACCHUS, USN was born in Kennebec, South Dakota, attended the University of Notre Dame in 1944-45, and graduated from the United States Naval Academy in 1949. He served his first tour of duty aboard the USS MACON (CA 132), and the USS UNION (AKA 106). He attended the Officers Basic Submarine School from July until December 1952. Since Submarine School he has served aboard the USS RONQUIL (SS 396), the Fleet Sonar School, San Diego, California, on the Staff of COMSUBRON FIVE, and as Executive Officer of the USS BAYA (AGSS 318) and the USS POMODON (SS 486). His latest tour of duty was as Commanding Officer of the USS SPOT (SS 413) at Pearl Harbor, This vessel was reactivated and turned over to the Chilean Navy under the Military Assistance Program. LCDR BACCHUS is married to the former Marilyn Lyons of Washington, D. C.

### BIOGRAPHY OF LCDR. D. L. BAILEY, USN

LCDR Daniel L. Bailey, USN was born in Huntsville, Alabama on 5 August 1924. He attended Alabama Polytechnic Institute 1942-43 and graduated from the U. S. Naval Academy in 1946 (class 47).

Prior to entering Submarine School in January 1949 LCDR Bailey served on USS CONE (DD 866), Staff COMINLANT and USS VERDIN (AMS 38). After Submarine School he was ordered to duty aboard USS TIGRONE (SSR 419) 1949-52; thence to USS BATFISH (SS 310) and from there to shore duty at the U. S. Naval Academy. After shore duty LCDR Bailey returned to sea aboard USS COBBLER (SS 344) as Executive Officer and Navigator 1955-57. He served during 1958-60 as Operations Officer, Staff Commander Oceanographic Systems, Atlantic in Norfolk, Va.

LCDR Bailey assumed command of USS BARRACUDA (SST 3) on 29 March 1960.
