1. In accordance with plans carried out during previous summers at Chefoo, arrangements have been made to conduct a Fleet Church Service ashore each Sunday morning at 10:00 o'clock. This service will be held in the auditorium of the Navy Y.M.C.A. through the courtesy of that organization. Officers and enlisted men, their families and friends are cordially invited to attend these services.

2. Through the courtesy of the resident Procurator, a special Fleet Mass will be celebrated each Sunday morning at 9:30 o'clock at the Roman Catholic Church.

3. A Sunday School for children of officers and enlisted men will be held at the same hour and place as the Fleet Church Service. All children of Navy families are invited to attend.

4. Enlisted men attending either of the above services are authorized to remain on liberty ashore after the service provided they are entitled to liberty on that day. Men not entitled to liberty shall return to their ships after the services are dismissed.

5. The Commander Destroyer Squadron believes that the establishment of these services as authorized above is a worthy and important activity, and requests the full cooperation of Commanding Officers in every way, especially through seeing that adequate arrangements are made for church parties to leave and return to their ships.
