SUCH A CEREMONY RATES THE PRESENTS OF DESTINGUISHED NAVAL FLAG OFFICERS WHO HAVE A DIRECT INTEREST IN THIS EVENT. SHARING THE PLATFORM IS REAR ADMIRAL J.O. COBB. UNITED STATES NAVY, COMMANDANT OF THE FIFTH NAVAL DISTRICT, REPRESENTING THE CHIEF OF NAVAL OPERATIONS FOR TRANSFER OF THE SHIP TO THE GOVERNMENT OF INDONESIA; REAR ADMIRAL J. B. HILDRETH, UNITED STATES NAVY, COMMANDER CRUISER-DESTROYER FLOTILLA FOUR. THE COMMANDER OF THE FLOTILLA INWHICH TIDEWATER IS ASSIGNED; AND COMMODORE SUKARDJO, INDONESIAN NAVAL ATTACHE' TO THE UNITED STATES WHO IS IN NORFOLK TO REPRESENT THE INDONESIAN GOVERNMENT IN ACCEPTANCE AND TRANSFER OF THE SHIP. OF COURSE, EVERY SHIP MUST HAVE A COMMANDING OFFICER. COLONEL ARUF HAS, THE HONOR TO BE THE SHIP'S FIRST COMMANDING OFFICER ONCE IT IS TRANSFERRED TO THE INDONESIAN GOVERNMENT.

THE DECOMMISSIONING OF A SHIP BEING TRANSFERRED TO A FOREIGN GOVERNMENT IS NOT AN EASY TASK. IT REQUIRES THE UPMOST OF PLANNING AND COORDINATION BETWEEN THE VARIOUS SHIP'S DEPARTMENTS AND BETWEEN THE SHIP AND OTHER COMMANDS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE VARIETY OF FUNCTIONS ASSOCIATED WITH HOWEVER, THIS HUGE INAMIMATE STEEL THIS TYPE OF OPERATION. STRUCTURE WHICH FLOATS CAN ONLY BE GIVEN RECOGNITION AFTER MANNED WITH OFFICER AND MEN WHO TAKE PRIDE IN THEIR WORK HUMAN ELEMENT IS ADDED.
