

HISTORY OF USS KISHWAUKEE (AOG 9)

USS KISHWAUKEE (AOG 9) is a gasoline tanker 310 feet in length capable of carrying more than 700,000 gallons of liquid cargo. Carrying petroleum products such as jet fuel, aviation gasoline and diesel oil, the ship has provided in the past few years of the Vietnam War, close-in support for the Army, Navy-Marine Corps Team. In addition to fuel, other types of liquid cargo such as water have been carried by AOGs as well as light freight and provisions.

The ship was named for the Kishwaukee River in Winnebago County, Illinois and built by Cargill, Incorporated at Savage, Minnesota. The name Kishwaukee comes from the Sioux Indian language and means "clear waters". Her keel was laid on 25

September 1942 and she was launched 24 July 1943.

The first commissioning of KISHWAUKEE took place at New Orleans, Louisiana, 27 May 1944. By July 1944, she had joined Service Squadron EIGHT and started making repeated supply runs to the advance bases on Johnston, Midway, Palmyra, and Canton Islands.

In October 1944, she participated in the Battle of Leyte Gulf where she repelled repeated air attacks and went on to refuel

carriers and provide numerous other services.

After the end of hostilities KISHWAUKEE performed normal tasks until the outbreak of the Korean War in 1951, when once again the need for close-in logistics support developed. She was then transporting needed materials from the Mid-Pacific Islands. In June of 1953, she supplied the bases in Alaska and later made a voyage to Borneo, Guam, Formosa, and Indo-China (now Vietnam).

The ship was decommissioned in 1958 at Astoria, Oregon and remained there until October 1965. KISHWAUKEE was recommissioned 1 September 1966 at Northwest Marine and Iron

Works in Portland.

Since her recommissioning KISHWAUKEE has made three deployments in support of the Vietnam War effort, delivering over 25 million gallons of fuel to the forces ashore in the I CORPS area.
