Admiral Land, for whom the AS-39 is named, made major contributions to submarine development. He was born in Canon City, Colo. Graduate of the University of Wyoming, Naval Academy, and Massachusetts Institute of Technology, he became a naval constructor prior to WW I. As chief of the Bureau of Construction and Repair from 1932 to 1937 he supervised the design and development of submarines that formed the backbone of the U.S. submarine fleet in WW II. After retirement from the Navy in 1938, he headed the Maritime Commission; was administrator of the War Shipping Administration during WW II. The Company

In 1959, Lockheed Aircraft Corporation, seeking to diversify its product lines, purchased Puget Sound Bridge and Dredging. Name of the company became Lockheed Shipbuilding and Construction Company in 1965. Since acquiring the Seattle company with its two shipyards — Yard 1 on Harbor Island where the LAND is being launched today and Yard 2 on the other side of the West Waterway of the Duwamish — Lockheed has built a series of vessels: light cruisers, destroyers, frigates, amphibious transport ships, and others in addition to carrying on active ship repair and commercial steel businesses. Among ships delivered by Lockheed in the 1970's are amphibious transports (LPD), frigates (FF), M/V SUGAR ISLANDER (bulk carrier), M/V COLUMBIA (Alaskan ferry), and POLAR class icebreakers (WAGB).

Submarine Tenders are Providers

The AS-39 is an auxiliary ship, providing mobile support to nuclear-powered SSN-688 LOS ANGELES class attack submarines. The AS-39 and its sister ship, AS-40 FRANK CABLE, building on Shipway 3, will provide undersea craft and their crews with repairs, spare parts, provisions, and medical, dental, mail, and legal services. The ship will contain some 50 specialized shops. The ship will provide living quarters for the more than 1000 men manning the shops and operating the submarines alongside with temporary quarters for their crews. Submarines moored alongside can be provided with various service connections.
