4. Captain Raymond Mangus Anderson Jr., USN 5/24/1973 - 6/27/1975



Capt. Anderson was born in Lima, OH on April 23, 1924. He attended the U.S. Naval Academy and was commissioned Ensign on June 6, 1945.

His First duty assignment was to the USS PENSACOLA (CA-24), where he served as "A" Division Officer. Other assignments included attendance in Submarine School, duty aboard USS BAYA (SS-318) and USS LIONFISH (SS-298), NROTC Instructor at the Univ. of Virginia, Executive Officer of the USS SEA LEOPARD (SS-482), Chief Intelligence Analyst for the Commander Southern Command, and attendance in the U.S. Naval War College. In August on 1960 he took command of the USS SIRAGO (SS-485), served as ASW study coordinator at the War College followed by Operations and Planning Staff Officer for SUBFLOT TWO/SUBRON TWO.

In July of 1965 he assumed command of SUBDIV 81, then served as Chief Staff Officer for COMSERVRON 4 and in October of 1967 assumed command of USS CANISTEO (AO-99). In April 1969 he was assigned to the Joint Staff as Chief Political/Criteria Analysis Officer for the U.S. Military Assistance Command, Vietnam. He then served as Faculty Advisor, Seminar Chairman and Deputy Director Faculty Group C, Armed Forces Staff College. From July 1972 to May 1973 he was Force Readiness Officer for COMSERVLANT.

Capt. Anderson has a Bachelor of Science Degree in Naval Science from the U.S. Naval Academy and a Masters of Arts Degree in Government from Boston University. He has been awarded the Army Commendation Medal, the Navy commendation Medal, the Legion of Merit with Combat "V", and the Joint services Commendation Medal with oak leaf cluster.
