History of the U.S.S. SEMINOLE (AKA-104), submission of.

On Nomember 7, 1944, the keel of this vessel was laid at Wilmington, N.C. The North Carolina Shipbuilding Company launched the vessel, know as MC HULL 1703, North Carolina hull 194, on December 28, 1944, and submitted it for acceptance trials on February 5, 1945. Trials were conducted on February 6, 1945, the intervening period to March 8, 1945 being used in ferrying to Charleston, S.C., and in outfitting, prior to commissioning.

The USS SEMINOLE was commissioned on March 8, 1945 at Navy Yard, Charleston, 8.C. by Lt Comdr. E.L. BOTHWEIL, Ass't to Captain of the yard. Commander J.H. BUDD assumed command. Provisioning, deperming, and compass compensation occupied the ten days to March 18, 1945.

On March 18, 1945, the USS SEMINOLE sailed for Norfolk, Virginia and Chesapeake Bay for shakedown, availability at Navy Yard, and loading.

Cargo was completely loaded on April 8, and this wessel in company with USS MATHEWS (AKA-96) departed for Balboa, C.Z. Received notice of death of Commander-in-Chief, President Roosevelt, on April 12 and half-masted colors on April 13, in accordance with Article 332, paragraph 1-14 US Navy Regulations. Arrived At Balboa, C.Z. on April 14.

Departed from Balboa, C.Z. on April 15, in company with USS MATHEWS (AKA-96), USS MANTA (SS-29), and USS QUILLBACK (SS-424), destination Pearl Harbor, T.H. Arrived at destination April 30, 1945. Intervening time to May 7 used in unloading cargo.

From May 7 to May 14, conducted landing operations practice at Maalaea Bay, Maui Island, T.H. as part of Transport Squadron 13.10.2. Returned to Pearl Harbor and loaded cargo for Okinawa, which was completed on May 28, 1945.

Proceeded independently from Pearl Harbor for Eniwetok, Marshall Islands from May 28 to June 6. Anchored at Eniwetok from June 6 to June 17.

On June 17, underway independently from Eniwetok to Ulithi, Caroline Islands. Anchored at Ulithi on June 21, where we remained until July 10, 1945. As part of convoy UOK-36, this vessel sailed from Ulithi on July 10 for Okinawa, Ryukyu Islands, arriving on July 14. Period from July 14 to August 6 was spent in discharging cargo. During this time, it was necessary to put to sea on two occasions, because of typhoon warnings.

On August 6 the USS SEMINOLE departed from Okin awa in convoy OKU-17 for Ulithi, Caroline Islands, arriving on August 10. Under authority of Com-Marianas, this vessel then proceeded on August 13 for Peleliu, Palau, Islands steaming singly.

Upon arrival off Peleliu Islands on August 14, we commenced loading cargo and completed loading on August 21. Departed Peleliu on August 21 for Saipan, Marianas Islands, arriving August 24, 1945. Moved to Tinian Island on 30 August 1945 and to Guam on September 1, where remainder of cargo was unloaded.

Departed for Leyte, P.I. on September 4 and arrived on September 8. Left September 10 for Iloilo, Panay, P.I. and arrived September 11.

Loaded cargo and troops at Iloilo for Jinsen, Korea, departing September 18 and arriving Jinsen on September 25. Unloaded cargo at Jinsen, where this vessel remained until October 1, 1945.
