HISTORY OF THE U. S. S. NOBLE (APA 218)

The USS NOBLE was built by Permanente Metals Corporation and fitted out by the Kaiser Shipyard at Richmond, California in 1944. She was launched on 18 October 1944 and commissioned on 27 November of the same year. The NOBLE was named in honor of Noble Counties in Indiana, Ohio, and Oklahoma.

In January 1945, NOBLE sailed to the Western Pacific to participate in the Okinawa campaign. NOBLE was attached to the Atlantic Fleet from 1946 to 1949. She returned to San Diego in late 1949. In August 1950 NOBLE sailed for Korea to participate in the Inchon invasion, and other operations until July 1953.

Subsequent to the Korean conflict NOBLE conducted routine training operations in both the Eastern and Western Pacific areas, and in 1955 assisted in the evacuation of Chinese civilian and military personnel from the Tachen Islands to Formosa.

At the outset of the Cuban crisis on 27 October 1962 NOBLE loaded some 1400 Marines and their equipment and sailed for the Caribbean in company with other Pacific Fleet Amphibious Forces. She returned to San Diego in December, then deployed to the Western Pacific from March — December 1963 for a tour with the Seventh Fleet Amphibious Ready Group.

NOBLE conducted routine training operations in the San Diego area from December 1963 until 29 June 1964 when she arrived at Mare Island Naval Shipyard, Vallejo, California. Decommissioning ceremonies followed on 20 July 1964 preparatory to an overhaul at San Francisco Naval Shipyard September — December 1964 and ultimate transfer to the Government of Spain under the Mutual Assistance Program.
