The award was made for "bravery in action during the Okinawa campaign." As captain of an LCS, Lt. Greenleaf was instrumental in shooting down one Japanese plane and helping to account for two more of the suicide planes. Husband of the former Gladys Winlock, now residing with her parents in Lexington, the Belmont Naval officer entered service in March 1942 and has been in the Pacific theater since August, 1944. He is a graduate of Belmont High School and Brown University. Attending Harvard University School of Business Administration, he was to have been graduated in June, 1942, but entered the Naval Reserve three months before his scheduled graduation.
