On 21 July 1944, the Third Marine Division and the First Provisional Ma nise Brigade, with the 77th Infantry Division in reserve, began the invasion of Guam. The assault troops landed after the most complete pro-landing bom Guanent (an air and naval operation which lasted 13 days) in the Pacific bard in spite of the intense proparatory bombardment, the twenty-day cam paign to wrest the island from its determined defenders cost the lives of 1289 paga servicemen and more than 10.000 Japanese. The capture of Guan Amen is neighbors, Saipan and Tinian, provided the Allies with bases from which to launch the devastating B-29 raids which were climaxed by the use of atomic bomb on Hiroshima and Nagasaki.


Guam was the first occupied American territory to be retaken from the Japanese and, in addition to its obvious military value, the island's recapture provided a strong morale boost to the American people.

The latter colors are also the colors of Spain and allude to the discovery of the island of Guam by the Spanish under Magellan.

CREST: The winged qrenade refers to the Marines and the assault landinge made by sea and air based on and supported by the crossed anchors symbolic of the Navy, The wings also depict the winged helmet of the old Viking sea rovers, their intense love of individual freedom, and their aggrensive and fight. ing spirit.

SUPPORTERS: The winged alligatorn symbolize the triphibious concept of assault through the three mediums of sea, air and land. They also symbolise the ierce, tenacious spirit of the amphibious forces with the once scornful name "gotor" now being worn an a well earned mark of honor. The cronsed palm tronds symbolize victory and also allude to the tropical locotion of the island of GUAM.
