

The U.S.S. SHADWELL is the first ship of the United States Navy to bear that name. It commemorates the birthplace and early home of the author of the Declaration of Independence, Thomas Jefferson.

The estate where "Shadwell" stood was purchased by Colonel Peter Jefferson, father of Thomas, in the year of 1732, the consideration being, according to deeds still extant, "Henry Weatherbourne's biggest bowl of Arrack Punch". In 1738 he married a daughter of Isham Randolph and built on these lands the house called "Shadwell" in which his son Thomas was born in 1743. Colonel Jefferson named the estate after the parish in England where his wife was born.

Situated on the Rivana, a few miles west of Charlottesville, Va., on the slopes of the Blue Ridge, the home was a story and a half in height; had four spacious ground rooms and a hall, with garrett chambers above, common on those structures a hundred years since; also the usual huge outside chimneys planted against each gable like Gothic buttresses, but massive enough, had such been their use, to support the walls of a cathedral, instead of a low wooden cottage.

In the year 1770 SHADWELL was destroyed by fire and young Jefferson moved to Montecello, the magnificent home then under construction, just two miles away. All that remains of SHADWELL are ruins, a monument marking the site, and the memory of one of the greatest of Americans, a champion of religious and personal freedom and of the rights and dignity of man.

Order of Events

- 1000 All hands muster on upper mezzanine deck by divisions.
- 1015 The Prospective Commanding Officer meets the Commandant and Commissioning Party at the gangway and reports that all is in readiness for the commissioning ceremony.
- 1030 The Commandant and Party proceed to the Quarterdeck, and the Commandant orders the Bugler to sound "Attention", as the ceremonies commence.
1. The Commandant accepts the ship from Newport News Shipbuilding and Dry Dock Company.
 2. The Commandant refers to the directive from the Navy Department for Commissioning the ship.
 3. The Commandant directs the Commanding Officer to issue necessary orders for all hands to face the colors (forward gaff).
 4. The Commandant orders "Sound Colors". National Anthem played by band. National Ensign, Jack, and Commission Pennant, hoisted.
 5. The Executive Officer faces crew to front.
 6. The Executive Officer orders "Render Honors". Officers (only) hand salute at beginning of ruffles and flourishes. Band sounds ruffles and flourishes followed by Admiral's March. Commissioning Pennant is lowered and Admiral's flag is hoisted. Officers complete hand salute upon completion of ruffles and flourishes.
 7. Commandant asks Chaplain to offer invocation.
 8. The Commandant makes brief address and turns ship over to the Commanding Officer.
 9. The Commanding Officer (facing crew) reads his orders to command and assumes command.
 10. The Commanding Officer directs the Executive Officer to "Set the watch". The Executive Officer orders Ship's Boatswain to "Set the watch, first section". Boatswain pipes and sings out, "Set the watch, first section". Boatswain's mates pass the word forward and aft.
 11. The Navigator takes first watch as Officer-of-the-Deck and reports to the Executive Officer when the Watch has been set.
 12. The Executive Officer reports to the Commanding Officer that the watch has been set.
 13. The Executive Officer orders "Parade Rest".
 14. The Commanding Officer orders, "Pipe down".
