

THE SHIP

USS SPHINX' keel was laid 20 October 1944 at the Bethlehem Steel Yards, Hingham, Massachusetts, and was commissioned sevenand-one-half weeks later, 12 December 1944, as LST-963. She sailed for Jacksonville, Florida, where on 8 January 1945 she was decommissioned for conversion to a landing craft repair ship.

Upon recommissioning, 10 May 1945, and after accelerated training exercises, SPHINX sailed for the West Coast and duty as repair support for amphibious assault landing craft and minesweeping units of the Pacific Fleet. On 25 July 1946 SPHINX witnessed the "Baker Test" of the atomic bomb at Bikini Atoll as part of "Operation Cross Roads." After the war SPHINX returned to Long Beach, California, and was decommissioned in San Diego, California, 23 May 1947.

On 3 November 1950 SPHINX was recommissioned for service in the Korean conflict. On 15 August 1954 she sailed for Haiphong, Vietnam, in support of the "Passage to Freedom" evacuation of refugees after the division of Vietnam. SPHINX decommissioned for the third time on 30 January 1956 in San Diego.

SPHINX was called to duty once again and was commissioned 16 December 1967 in New Orleans, Louisiana. She arrived in Vung Tau, South Vietnam, 10 June 1968 and commenced operations in the Mekong River Delta area. Except for two six-week yard periods in Japan, SPHINX remained in the brown rivers continuously from June 1968 to May 1971. She arrived 2 July 1971 in Bremerton, Washington, for decommissioning.

Among the medals the ship has been awarded are the World War II Victory Medal, the Korean Service Medal, the United Nations Service Medal, the Vietnam Service Medal, the Navy Unit Commendation, and the Presidential Unit Citation.

SPHINX's PUC was awarded for 1969 service with the Mobile Riverine Force in Vietnam. Her two NUC's were received for riverine duty during 1968-69 and 1970-71. The National Defense Service Ribbon awards represent service during the Korean and Vietnam emergencies. SPHINZ earned one engagement star on the Korean Service Ribbon and eight on the Vietnam Service Ribbon.

The RVN MUC and RVN Campaign Ribbon are Vietnamese awards to which SPHINX is entitled; the UN Service Ribbon was earned in Korea. Ships or individuals who are entitled to wear the Korean Service Ribbon are also entitled to the UN Service Ribbon.
